CITY MANAGER'S UPDATE

Ontario offers many free events for families and visitors to enjoy throughout the holidays. Downtown Ontario is filled with joy as the streets along Euclid Avenue are lined with holiday decor provided by non-profit organizations: Christmas on Euclid Experience and the Greater Ontario Convention & Visitors Bureau. As part of the celebrations downtown, the Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony will occur on December 2 at Ontario Town Square. This Fall, the Ontario City Council approved the Ontario's Community College Promise Program. Ontario believes that all children within the City should have the opportunity to follow their dreams to attend a vocational or higher learning institution. To help fulfill this dream, the Ontario City Council established a scholarship program for high school graduates, which will provide free tuition for up to two consecutive years at a California community college of the student's choice. The goal of this program is to expand access to higher education for students and support local economic and workforce development initiatives. The City Council's primary operating goal has been to Regain Local Control of the Ontario International Airport. - Sprinkler problems



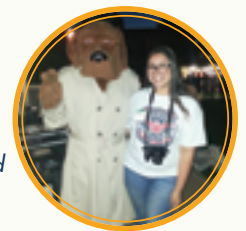

ROSE'S HALL AND THE GREAT NORTHER OF 1887

Friends Henry J. Rose and George Chaffey had a unique relationship: Their wives were sisters. George beckoned Henry to leave Toronto and settle in Ontario, where the weather promised him better health. So druggist Henry Rose came to Ontario in 1885 and in 1886 began construction of Rose Hall, a two-story ornamental building on the west side of Euclid between Holt and B Street, which was designed by another Chaffey related family from Canada, W. J. Waddingham--his wife and William B. Chaffey's wife were also sisters. The first floor of Rose's Hall was used as Henry Rose's drug store, with a section of the store set aside to deal hardware. The second floor was reserved as a meeting hall, often used as a lodge by the Ancient Order of United Workmen (AOUW) as well

where the Episcopal Church held its Sunday services...that is, until the Great Norther of 1887... A torrential windstorm kicked up and on December 13th a large gust knocked the second story off the building and it landed partially on the lot next door. The first floor was demolished underneath, but some said the second story landed with hardly any damage at all, inside or out. The community got together and helped Henry settle the second story on the lot and converted the hall into his drug store. A few years later Henry decided to build a new structure and sold the 2nd story to the Episcopal Church. It was eventually moved to its permanent home on the southeast corner of Euclid and C Street until it was demolished in 1960.
